# **US - CANADA 1998 MARCH FOR TIBET'S INDEPENDENCE**

The fourth annual "Walk For Tibet's Independence" will begin on March 10th, 1998 in Portland Oregon. For forty-five days marchers will go from Portland through Olympia, Tacoma, Belleview, Seattle, Everett, and Bellingham, Washington to Vancouver, Canada. The walk will end April 25th, the ninth birthday of Gedhun Choekyi Nyima (the Panchen Lama), the world's youngest political prisoner.

The walk is led by the 76 year old Thubten Jigme Norbu, the Dalai Lama's elder brother. Long a great and courageous advocate for the just cause of the Tibetan people to overcome the illegal occupation and despoliation of their homeland by the Communist Chinese government, Thubten Jigme Norbu will bravely step forth to lead a band of young and old Americans on a walk through the Great Northwest of the Pacific coast. Thousands of marchers and supporters will go with him and form a wave of humanity that cries out for the freedom and independence of Tibet.

# on Florida's "Splendid China" a statement by Taktser Tulku

The lies and deceptions put forth by the Chinese government started when they invaded the independent and sovereign nation of Tibet and called it a peaceful liberation. #### FRESH HUMAN BODY PARTS FOR SALE

The New York Times has reported that on February 24th FBI agents arrested two Chinese nationals. Chen Yong Wang and Xinqi Fu, "on charges of conspiring to arrange transplants of kidneys and other organs taken from the bodies of executed Chinese inmates." One of the arrested men, Wang, identified himself as a former prosecutor from Hainan Island, China. The two were set up for a sting operation by human rights activist, Harry Wu. Prior to the arrest Mr. Wu posing as a doctor had a meeting with Mr. Wang, which he secretly taped. Mr. Wu stated that Mr. Wang told him that he could guarantee delivery of the organs of at least 50 of the 200 prisoners executed annually on China's Hainan Island. According to Mr. Wu, Mr. Wang told him that kidney transplants would cost \$30,000. and that eye comeas would cost \$5,000. Wu turned his tape over to FBI agents and the sting operation began. Undercover FBI agents, posing as doctors, met with Mr. Wang, who reportedly told them that he could obtain, "pancreases, livers, lungs and skin." The press office at China's embassy in Washington had no comment when first asked about this matter by the press. The Chinese government has long denied that the practice of selling body parts obtained from executed prisoners is widespread in China. {That it exists at all is amazing} According to Harry Wu, Mr. Wang, the former prosecutor, contradicted this denial by telling him that "prisoners have no political rights". China has one of the highest annual rates of capital punishment. equivalent in the United States would be an annual rate of 200 executions. The actual annual rate in the US is less than 20. In China it is around 2000. In China and Chinese occupied Tibet petty criminals are sentenced to death quite often. It is clearly a form of social control. It is from these victims body parts that former prosecutors and probably others obtain up to a 25% commission.

After the arrests of Mr. Wang and Mr. Fu a State Department spokesman said "we're naturally concerned about these allegations, and we're looking into it." Just a year ago, Stanley O. Roth, Assistant Secretary of State for East Asian & Pacific Affairs said in a letter to Sen. Jessie Helms, that if it were true that Chinese prisoners were being killed to sell their body parts, "this would be among the grossest violations of human rights imaginable".

#### **Huh? Religious Freedom Chinese style**

On feb. 23rd, while a US delegation of clergyman was visiting China to investigate religious freedom in China, Chinese Premier Li Peng told the directors of China's Religious Affairs Bureau that socialism must be imposed on all religious work in China. He "stressed the importance of the implementation" of the Communist Party's policies on religious work.

The US delegation consisted of Monseignor Theodore McCarrick, Archbishop of Newark, NJ., Reverend Don Argue, President of the National Association of Evangelicals and Rabbi Arthur Schneir, President of the Appeal of Conscience Foundation. The delegation visited Tibet, Nanjing, Chengdu and Beijing. It was not reported whether this delegation asked the Chinese authorities permission to visit with the eight year old Panchen Lama, Gedhun Choekyi Nyima, the World's youngest religious prisoner of conscience. For the past three years the Panchen Lama has been kept in secret detention by the Chinese government. During that time there has been no reliable evidence that this eight year old boy is still alive.

#### The Tide is Turning!

The Geneva State Parliament of the Swiss Federation on Feb. 20th unanimously adopted a resolution that calls upon the Federal Swiss authorities to accord diplomatic status to the Government of Tibet in Exile. The resolution emphatically recognizes that for many centuries the Tibetan people have independently governed their own affairs and that the Government of Tibet in Exile in Dharamsala is the continuation of the state authority that existed in Tibet since at least 1911. The resolution made the following four demands of the Geneva State government:

- 1.) To officially receive His Holiness the Dala Lama or a delegation of the Government of Tibet in Exile during their next visit to Geneva.
- 2.) To recommend to the Federal authorities to give diplomatic status to the Government of Tiet in Exile.
- 3.) To open economic and cultural exchanges with the Government of Tibet in Exile.
- 4.) To give material support to the representative of the Government of Tibet in Exile.

"Seven Years in Tibet" & "Kundun" a Film Review by Max Butler 2/23/98

There really is no comparison between the two films, "Seven Years in Tibet" and "Kundun". The first is more your typical Hollywood adventure film using remote Tibet as its exotic setting. It adhered to the book of the same name in name only. It was simply "box-office" and a vehicle for budding superstar Brad Pitt to cavort in. True there was the "lost & found" aspect of the main character's personality, but that was just a feeble attempt to make that character seem real. In actuality, it failed to do so and not even Argentina proved to be a good substitute for Tibet.

"Kundun" on the other hand is a much more serious attempt at making a meaningful film and one that has much more artistically going for it. The major focus of the film is naturally on the main character, which in this case is not just a person, but the reincarnation in human form of an idea - Compassion. Throughout the film this embodiment is challenged, and tested again and again by the powerful forces of Dialectical Materialism. Probably because of this, a cast of well know Hollywood stars was not needed. Instead, mainly exile Tibetans with little or no previous acting experience were used. It is to the credit of the director, Martin Scorsese, and the strong faith of the Tibetan actors in His Holiness the Dalai Lama, that the actors' performances were remarkably good. Watch out Hollywood!

Even though the Dalai Lama' apartment in the Potala was a little reminiscent of Lobsang Rampa novels, the transformation of Morocco into Tibet was a cunning use of all the artful tricks that Hollywood could muster. So were the dream sequences that with forceful symbolism conveighed at the same time the Dalai Lama's prescience and the horrendous suffering of the Tibetan people. All of this was enhanced by the awesome drone of the musical score by Philip Glass. Melissa Mathison's screenplay also gave us just a tiny peak at the darker side of Tibetan political intrigue. However, when this is compared to the methodical and banal evil dished out by Mao and his generals, even the most corrupt Tibetan official seems like a saint.

Although "Seven Years in Tibet" and "Kundun" are very different in quality and purpose, they both in their small and big ways have educated people in the West, especially in the U.S., about Tibet and the oppression suffered by the Tibetan people at the hands of the Chinese Communists. Unfortunately, these days it takes the entertainment industry to do this. It is a pity that Hollywood is not more courageous and that the public has to be entertained by the truth before it can realize what it is. Even if this happens it does not mean that when the public sees "Made in China" on a product label that it will read instead "Murder in Tibet". A lot more work has to be done before that happens.

Well, I hope that Hollywood continues to make more films about Tibet. Perhaps Steven Segal can produce, direct and star in a film featuring a non-violent commando squad of Tibetans, that he leads on a raid into China in order to free the Panchen Lama and his parents. It would be a great action film. It could even get the Chinese Communist government to produce proof that this little boy and his parents are still alive. The Clinton administration certainly has not been able to do this! Why not Hollywood?
