Bay Area Chinese and Tibetan Friendship Congratulates Liu Xiaobo on Nobel Peace Prize

(October 8, 2010) The Bay Area Chinese and Tibetan Friendship (BACTF) would like to congratulate Liu Xiaobo, the Nobel Peace Laureate of 2010, and the Norwegian Nobel Committee, which made a just and courageous choice despite Chinese pressures and threats.
